We Are Go

The Scouts Aotearoa Board has given approval for the Regatta to proceed. The Board met today and confirm that the event can go ahead based on their approved budget for NR29.

The approved budget sees the final entry fee increase by a small amount from our preliminary fee estimate

The Final Fees are

- Regatta Youth \$550
- Leaders \$125
- Staff Free

Groups will be bulk invoiced the regatta fees based on registrations.

10% of the fees will be invoiced on the 1st of September 2021 with payment expected by 30th of September 2021, and the balance will be invoiced on the 31st of October 2021. With payment expected by the 30th November 2021.

We understand that some Groups may have some grants pending on those dates and therefore apply for some leeway to allow the grant funding to come in prior to payment. If this applies, please contact Gilbert Robertson.

All attendees must register using this system.

There are 5 possible categories (all ages based on 1st day of Regatta):

- Contingent Leader (this is any leader attending as part of a contingent)
- Regatta Junior (10+ but younger than 13 years 6 months)
- Regatta Intermediate (13 years 6 months and older but younger than 15 years 6 months)
- Regatta Senior (15 years 6 months and older and still eligible to participate as a youth)
- Regatta Staff

Group Leaders will receive an ongoing updated list of those youth from their group that have registered and will have to confirm their approval for those youth to attend. Registrations close on the 31st of August but on a case-by-case basis late additions may be allowed.






NR29 Regatta Duty Watch
